
OUR EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

VOLUNTEER HIGHLIGHT

My name is Kelsey and I reside in Wisconsin with my wonderful husband and our two beautiful daughters who all fill my heart with love and joy. I have my degree in Psychology with minor in Criminal Justice and emphases in Substance Abuse Counseling and Human Services. My career, though, is as a Salesforce Administrator.



Although my life sounds "perfect", I have had my ups and downs like we all have. Recently, I was in a traumatic car accident which then caused me to be diagnosed with many brain health diagnoses: Borderline Personality Disorder, Bipolar Disorder, PTSD, and Generalized Anxiety. These do not describe me as a person, they are just a part of me.

As a young child, I was raped by a family member. This caused my PTSD, but the car accident triggered it. The nightmares feel real, and the anxiety that comes with it is overwhelming. After the car accident, I found the Fountain of Youth Program. Caprice helped me through the worst of the worst. We worked on everything from parenting, marriage, to my career. I look forward to co-facilitating discussions with Caprice and Grant going forward. It will be interesting to see if my story and experiences will have an impact.

ABOUT THE PROGRAM



Each week participants voluntarily come in to develop the mindset and skills needed to not only get a job but turn that job into a life-long career. They learn skills necessary to be successful and we help them break down the barriers they face. At the end of each 30 day program they do a mock interview with IWD to prepare themselves for their new career.

After your initial investment into the training we do all the work for you! Partner with the Fountain of Youth Program to find employees that will not only get the job, but keep the job. This program gives you a great employee that will last.

What about the outcome?




The Fountain of Youth serves individuals impacted by generational poverty. The majority of the community members we work with are aged 18-40. All of our participants are intrinsically motivated attendees and desire change for themselves and for future generations.

Services in addition to the curricula include:
Assistance in finding employment paying more than the minimum wage with opportunities for growth in each position, mentoring to reinforce concepts/ideas presented in class, & individual goal setting.

Examination of their own experience of poverty and exploration of the issues in their community that impact poverty. This allows them to gain invaluable insight from each other and take action to end the cycle in their own lives and for future generations.

Learning how to build positive resources and develop healthy relationships in order to increase stability in employment and personally in their own lives.

NEW PARTNERSHIPS



The Fountain of Youth is pleased to announce a new chapter in our tradition of developing community partnerships to improve the wellness of Dubuque area residents. We have joined with our friends at Hillcrest Family Services - the area's premier community mental health provider - to deliver brain health assessment and counseling services to participants in the Fountain of Youth's programs.

Through this collaborative relationship, a skilled and licensed mental health counselor from Hillcrest holds appointments on three days per week with FoY participants at our downtown location. All service recipients start on the roster of the Partners in Change program, FoY's curriculum-based design that helps improve self-awareness, self-regulation, and self-development. If participants decide that brain health counseling would benefit their overall well-being, the Hillcrest professional does in-depth assessments and begins regularly scheduled counseling sessions.

The Fountain of Youth and Hillcrest Family Services look forward to this partnership as it grows in fulfilling our mutual commitment to the sustained wellness of the greater Dubuque community.
